Why does this Nominee deserve to be recognized for their commitment to vocational service?

Describe the nominee's vocation and demonstrate how the nominee has exemplified professionalism and exceptional customer service

Fabian O'Connor (aka The Dancing Policeman) grew up in Kingston. Upon leaving high school, he joined the Jamaican Defense Force ("JDF") and after completing his training was assigned to the Coast Guard where his last role was as a chef.

O'Connor migrated to the Cayman Islands with his family four years ago, and began working as a security guard with Sterling Security in George Town.

O'Connor joined the RCIPS in May 2017 where he was assigned to BEAT 8 - WATERFRONT. Although the waterfront area is part of Beat 8 in George Town, due to unprecedented numbers of cruise ship passengers arriving in Grand Cayman, there are officers assigned specifically here, in order to ensure the safety of pedestrians and motorists travelling through this high-traffic, visitor-heavy area. In addition to directing foot and vehicle traffic in the area, these officers also interact with the many stores and businesses in the area, to assist in addressing any issues and concerns they may have.

AC Fabian O' Connor is one of the officers assigned to the waterfront area of Beat 8. He works alongside other officers - from Monday to Friday during day time hours. AC O' Connor is a unique and treasured member of our community, I work in the vicinity and am privileged to interact and observe on a daily basis this particular Police Officer as he deals with heavy traffic and large crowds of pedestrians. I see local drivers hooting and waving as they pass by the officers - what prompted me to nominate AC O'Connor for this award was the day that I watched him (with the aid of a fellow officer) carry an elderly cruise passenger in her wheelchair across the pedestrian walkway. I was absolutely amazed by the exceptional commitment to customer service.

My research and inquiries conducted for the purpose of submitting this nomination have revealed a truly remarkable individual who should be recognized for his professionalism and exceptional service to the Cayman Islands.

How has the nominee exemplified the tenants of the Rotary 4 – way test? Truth, Fairness, Building Goodwill and Better Friendships, Benevolence

- 1. Assistance with the emergency care of an individual who suffered a seizure his quick intervention helped to save a life
- 2. May 2017, O' Connor once again assisted with emergency care when a tourist fell into a glass door, the shattered glass caused multiple injuries, using his shirt from his back, the officer bound her wounds in an attempt to stop the bleeding
- 3. This officer has been instrumental in building goodwill between the police force and both the local and international community that he serves. This has had a positive impact on all parties concerned
- 3. Auxiliary Constable Fabian O'Connor entered into a partnership with the National Roads Authority to improve the traffic signs and road markings on the waterfront and in central George Town.

Mr. O'Connor, known as the "Dancing Policeman" for the energetic way he ushers pedestrians and traffic on Harbour Drive at the waterfront, has worked with the NRA's supervisor of Signs and Lines, Delroy Myles, to paint direction signs, chevrons, double yellow lines and brightened stop marks in downtown George Town.

The pair secured permission from the Traffic Management Panel to make those improvements, and they were able to complete the task of brightening the signs and lines over two Sundays.
